
Who we are

Generations Without Qat was founded in 2007 by a group of development professionals as voluntary work and officially become a licensed NGO in 2010. The organization works on two interventions: awareness main and development. Since 2014, the organization has provided rapid response activities and relief support to conflict-affected communities in multiple sectors, including shelter, NFIs, health ,WASH ,education and CCCM. Since our inception in 2010, GWQ has dedicated its efforts to supporting communities in the country, especially the most vulnerable ones, in providing livelihoods and boosting health and education. The organization's target beneficiaries are young people, women and children, conflict-affected communities, and vulnerable populations.

Introduction

Due to funding shortfalls, humanitarian assistance and services for millions of Yemenis have been affected. The response to the worsening situation, including floods, has not been able to increase quickly. All sectors are impacted by funding gaps, with few receiving only about a quarter of the required funding by the end of July. For example, the Food Security and Agriculture Sector received 26% of the \$2.1 billion requested to provide food assistance to 17.4 million people. The health sector was funded at 25% of the \$398 million required to provide healthcare services to 12.6 million people, and the nutrition sector group received only 23% of the \$442 million needed to help 6.5 million people with nutritional support.

Other sectors such as shelter and non-food items, coordination and common services, refugees and migrants, and protection were funded at even lower levels. The rapid response mechanism was the most underfunded sector with 0% funding, followed by education at 4% and water, sanitation, and hygiene at 7%.

Generations without Qat is one of many INGOs & NGOs that received funding from several donors to implement around nine interventions in various sectors such as WASH, CCCM, peacebuilding, development, good governance, protection, health, education ,shelter, and livelihoods.

Project summary

Generations Without Qat implemented a project in Wash sector in Aden Governorate that was funded by Development and Peace - Canada.

The project targeted three IDP hosting sites in the districts of Al-Buraiqah and Al-Mansoura. The project was implemented in order to increase the access of the targeted families to clean and safe water and appropriate sanitation facilities and to enhance hygiene practices for the targeted IDPs in the targeted sites, where access to sanitation for IDP families in the hosting sites was improved through a combination of WASH activities that were implemented for seven months.



To contribute to save lives and reduce the outbreak of infectious diseases related to WASH (such cholera) in Aden Governorate.







Project Activities

- Supplying and installing 53 emergency latrines in the targeted IDP hosting sites.
- 2 Digging 10 new cesspits in Al-Diyani sites and Bir Fadl sites.
- 3 Covering 15 open cesspits in Al-Farsi sites.
- 4 Supplying and installing 92 solar energy systems to light trines in the targeted hosting sites (53 new latrines + 39 old ones).






Project summary

This project was considered as a platform to engage families and communities to change wrong behaviors and was an opportunity for dialogue with families on child survival and protection issues as well as focusing on Covid 19 by integrating specific messages to increase acceptance of basic health messages through direct participation by community volunteers along with mothers clubs which were formed to provide a forum to enhance mothers' knowledge and increase the adoption of basic family practices.




The project aimed to launch an integrated, high-impact social communication and behavioral change initiative that focuses on 5 + 1 core family care practices - with an emphasis on COVID-19 - as a platform to engage families and communities. This is also expected to provide opportunities for dialogue with families on critical issues of child survival, newborn care and protection .





Project Activities

- 1 Conducting eighteen training sessions in communication skills and six life-saving messages related to emergencies in the targeted areas for 360 volunteer facilitators (300 volunteers 45 males and 255 females) + 60 female CEVs.
- Conducting six workshops for 90 community leaders and mosque preachers to participate and coordinate with them (one day * 90 RLs). The workshop focused on cholera and COVID prevention practices.
- 3 Conducting 40,000 house-to-house visits and 12,000 focus group discussions. Printing and distributing IEC on main health messages.
- Printing and distributing IEC materials on main health messages.



Project summary

This project was a reflection of the 2021 HRP that aimed to ensure integrated assistance to 1020 IDP HHs (4918 individuals

(W 1097, G 1292, M 1016, B 1513) living in hosting sites in Al Mukha District, Taiz Governorate, through CCCM package of activities including the establishment of functional community self-governing committees with inclusive participation and conducting a functional monthly meeting of self-governing committees in 12 IDP Hosting Sites; training for NOG partners working in Al Mukha & local authorities on SMC and organizing monthly coordination meetings establishing functional Complaints and Feedback Mechanisms for 12 hosting sites, and cash of \$75 for maintenance & shelter upgrades to 640 HHs. This project covered 12 sites through multi-sector monitoring (including inhabitant list verifications) assessments, monitoring & updating of population movements. Women were ensured to participate in training and regular meetings of local authorities and partners. Also, they were encouraged to represent IDPs in the community committees. Females participated in mass communication campaigns and population movement updating. People with special needs were also encouraged to represent IDPs in the sites structure of the established community committees. 200 host community HHs (1400 individuals) in the surrounding of the hosting sites were targeted with awareness and IEC materials.

GWQ covered 12 IDPs hosting sites in Al-Mukha ed (1- Al Hasseb, 2- Al Shaheed Hamood, 3- Al Sowais, 4- Al Qahira, 5- Al Shatheli, 6- Al Hali, 7- Al Niaba old building, 8- Old Government building, 9- Al Zahaira, 10-Al Raowais, 11- Al Qatabia and 12- Al Holaibi).







Generations Without Qat has built nine housing units for families that have taken Al-Hikma School as shelter and then as a second phase of the project will partially rehabilitate the school to help students return to school, as Al-Hikma School is the only school in the area (the center of the district) that will embrace hundreds of students and give them hope for change from their current dark present.





Project summary

To achieve the five-year strategic plan, which aims to achieve sustainable development and involve all segments of society in the peace-building process, Generations Without Qat implemented two projects in the development, peacebuilding, and good governance sector.

Where the project to promote the values of coexistence through social activities within the Women's Sports Center in Taiz Governorate focused on integrating the females from the host community and IDPs through the establishment of a sports club for women in Taiz.

The club is also a safe space for women to participate in sports activities as well as other social activities and thus contribute to coexistence between IDPs and the host community in Taiz. Men have participated in the activities of the center, but only for solemn events as the center is a community center that needs general support for women from the community (males and females).

In this project, which lasted for 6 months, which aimed to improve the integration of IDPs into society by creating





a safe space for women (IDPs and host community) to attend social activities in Taiz, 8 women and 2 men (IDPs and host community) were selected based on their motivations to manage a sports center and a club management committee was formed and then they were trained on several topics including Resolution 1325, Peacebuilding and Gender-Based Violence. Where weekly activities are carried out within the club for women, such as chess and basketball, in addition to a small corner café through which cakes, juices, and coffee are served.

Project summary

The project of "Improve the meaningful impact of women in relief, recovery and peace operations in Yemen", which was carried out in each of the governorates of Aden and Taiz from January to December 2022, included several outputs related to the women's protection sector, such as Support survivors, women activists, and first responders directly, with psycho-social support and dialogue about safety, self-care, and social support. Building the capabilities of local government officials in the governorates of Taiz and Aden in terms of protection issues, empowering women's groups, first responders, and other caregivers to have a better understanding of prevention and survivor-centered responses, and providing grant money to organizations and women's groups to carry out protection projects, to improve women's protection and lessen gender-based violence.








Summary

The 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence is an annual international campaign that kicks off on 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and runs until 10 December, Human Rights Day.

This year, under the Unite theme Activism to End Violence against Women & Girls, GWQ kept the spotlight on gender-based violence facilitated by technology.

GWQ focused on the consciousness of youth and women in gender-based violence prevention and response measures as well as the power of combining art and activism (activism) in disrupting violence in both the real and virtual worlds so that everyone can exercise their inalienable right to feel safe and thrive wherever they find themselves

GWQ held a workshop targeting ten active participants from Taiz University, Faculty of Mass Communication to introduce them to the 16-day campaign to combat violence against women, including electronic blackmail. Following that, GWQ organized a technical and awareness event about violence against women in the courtyard of Taiz University, Faculty of Arts.

GWQ Participated and actively promote the online digital crowdfunding campaign under #UNTFeminist and #TrustFeminists, under the theme "UNITE: Activism to End Violence against Women & Girls!" every day during the 16 Days of Activism.

GWQ supported wearing orange color, and "orange" virtual spaces e.g., websites, social media accounts, etc. On the 25 November and throughout the 16 days until 10 December. GWQ organized virtual seminars under the slogan, UNITE: Activism to End Violence against Women & Girls!" to raise public awareness and encourage individuals, organizations, and others to take action during the 16 days.



Campaign summary

Due to the ongoing conflict in Yemen, which has lasted for seven years and has had a devastating impact on all aspects of economic and social life, children are increasingly reluctant to enroll in school and the number of dropouts is rising.

To address this issue, Generations Without Qat (GWQ) is working to increase enrollment through campaigns that highlight the importance of education and help students return to school in a safe and accessible educational environment that provides equal access for all children, especially those affected by the conflict such as displaced persons and girls. Therefore, GWQ has launched a back-to-school campaign to coincide with the start of the 2022 school year.

The campaign included various events such as entertaining and educational activities and games for children in the presence of their parents. In addition, a child-friendly educational event was held at both Yarmouk School for Girls and September School for Boys in Al-Mudaffar District, Taiz Governorate where the event was opened with a recitation of the Holy Qur'an and included various literary and poetic performances and theatrical plays. Besides, parents who support school activities were honored and prizes were distributed to students.




